1) New Organizing Committee

2) Working groups (WGs)

The kick off of two Commission WGs is in progress. They are joint working groups with the International Association of Geodesy (IAG) and International Earth Rotation and Reference Systems Service (IERS), so already approved from the side of those organizations. The first one is the IERS Joint Working Group Prediction of Earth Orientation Parameters (PEOP) and the second one the IAG Joint Working Group Consistent Improvement of the Earth Rotation Theory (CIERT).

3) IAU Symposium 401: Advancing Reference Systems, Ephemeris, and Standards

IAU supported as an IAU Symposium the meeting "Advancing Reference Systems, Ephemeris, and Standards: from the Earth and the Moon to Solar System Bodies" (IAUS 401) that will be held from August 4 to 9, 2025 at the National University of La Plata (UNLP), La Plata (Argentina).

The IAU Symposium 401 was a joint proposal of our Commission with the IAU Commissions A3 Fundamental Standards and X2 Solar System Ephemerides, and the Working Groups Time Metrology Standards and Cartographic Coordinates & Rotational Elements.

The IAUS 401 registration, abstracts submission, and IAU travel grant are already open. The symposium will be in a hybrid format, to welcome both in-person and online participation.
